

8% (*N* = 19,656) of the global study population of .81 million participants. The bullying prevalence reported across the globe ranged from 9.02% to 55.26%, while the Asian region reported the highest levels of bullying, with an overall prevalence of .48%. The global bullying prevalence was higher among males, compared with females. In addition, bullying prevalence was found to be higher among children who experienced difficulties in their academic performance, were inactive, and had no friends. On the other hand, bullying prevalence was lower among children who were overweight, had a close friend, were treated unfairly by their peers, were bullied themselves, and did not get along with classmates. In terms of the other features of bullying, children who were bullied were also less active, had less friends, were treated unfairly, and were bullied. Furthermore, among children who were bullied, the probability of being bullied decreased with the time spent playing. Although bullying was more prevalent among older children, compared with younger ones, it was still an issue among children of all ages. Bullying was also more prevalent among children from higher-income countries, compared with lower-income countries. Figure 3](#Fig3){ref-type="fig"} represents the geographical distribution of the in-school prevalence of bullying for the five countries of Africa, Asia, North America, South America, and Oceania. Fig. 3The geography of in-school prevalence of bullying The overall in-school bullying prevalence was higher among children with limited English proficiency, and the magnitude of the effect size was higher among children who came from families with lower parental education levels. Moreover, among children who were bullied, the probability of being bullied decreased with the level of their academic performance, compared with children with high academic performance. The overall in-school bullying prevalence was also higher among children who were from single-parent families and were from families of lower socioeconomic status, compared with their counterparts. Regarding the region of the world, Table 4](#Tab4){ref-type="table"} shows that Asia (39.26%) had the highest prevalence of bullying, followed by Africa (35.36%), Oceania (35.16%), Europe (32.27%), and North America (27.97%). Asia was also characterized by the highest prevalence of perpetration (14.07%) and victimization (17.31%) of bullying, compared with the other regions. Table 5](#Tab5){ref-type="table
